The first day of winter doesn't officially arrive until December 21, but it sure seems to have gotten an early start! We have had several sub-freezing nights already, and several days where the temperature has barely topped the mid-30s. The marina is now totally winterized. Water service on the docks has been shut off and pumpout service has been discontinued until spring. We continue fuel dock service and Ship Store operations throughout the winter months, and the courtesy docks are always available to boaters who choose water access to the many year-round amenities at Doc's, The Anchor, and the golf course and club house.

The marina and Ship Store operations are now open from 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. Monday-Saturday. We are closed on Sundays throughout the winter months. This month, the fuel dock and Ship Store will be closed for extended weekends over the Christmas and New Year's holidays. We always check docks, boats, lifts, and power service daily, but Ship Store and fuel dock operations will be closed Saturday-Monday December 24-26 and December 31-lanuary 2.

Colder weather means an end to the record boat rental season at Sail Grand. The vast majority of the rental boats and all of the personal watercraft have been winterized and pulled for the winter; but we realize there are lake lovers who want the opportunity to continue their boating ventures during the winter months. ### **Member Profile: Janet Link**

Janet Link loves the Grand Lake area so much, she named a magazine after it — Grand Paradise!

It's difficult to find someone who knows more about the people and places on Grand Lake than Janet Link. As a three-time president of the South Grand Lake Area Chamber of Commerce and a two-time President of the Vinita Chamber of Commerce, she has been involved in a wide variety of events and programs supporting the Grand Lake business community; but that doesn't even count what she does in "real life."

As General Manager of four area newspapers - the Vinita Daily Journal, the Nowata Star, The American, and the Grand Laker - and publisher of Grand Paradise Magazine, one of the most far-reaching annual publications promoting the Grand Lake area, her impact is wideranging and frequent!

Her newspaper ownership is in partnership with the Weatherford, Oklahoma-based Reid Newspaper Group, which also owns six other newspapers including the *Grove Sun, Miami News-Record, Delaware County Journal* and three other newspapers in Weatherford, Bethany, and Perry.

"From our plant in Vinita, we print seven newspapers. Printing operations in Vinita and Weatherford also print the Cherokee Nation's *Cherokee Phoenix* which has a circulation of more than 150,000 twice a month," she says. "Cherokee Nation Principal Chief Chuck Hoskin, Jr. is from Vinita and he's a good friend of mine. It's great to have him right here to guide us in that venture."

Janet has always lived in Oklahoma. Born and raised in Tulsa, she graduated from Central High School while working for the U.S. Post Office before marrying and raising two children, both of whom are still in business in Green Country. In 1990, she married John Link who, at the time, was living in Colorado working for Frederick Printing, a large printing operation whose printing jobs included all the tickets for the Denver Nuggets.

When the two married, the result was a beautifully blended family and the beginning of an unparalleled legacy of newspaper operations in Oklahoma.

"John hired a preacher he found in the want ads in the Denver

Post. We got married and our families blended instantly. My kids became his kids and his kids became my kids," Janet laughs. "He moved to Oklahoma and we had a little cabin on South Grand Lake. He saw an ad in the Claremore Progress newspaper about the Reid Newspaper Group looking for a General Manager for their newspaper operation in Vinita. He interviewed, got the job and, as they say, the rest is history."

It was the beginning of a northeastern Oklahoma publishing operation that impacts Green Country far beyond the shores of Grand Lake.

"I got involved personally in the newspaper business because John was short-staffed in Vinita, and he asked me to come in and help out," she laughs. "The first thing I saw was an ad that had merchants supporting the local FFA Chapter. I remember saying, 'there are only 10 businesses on this ad. Is that all you've got?" I pulled out the phone book and started making calls. We ended up with 20 more businesses on the ad – and I've been here ever since – more than 30 years now."

Janet has always been in sales, rising to the position of Vice-President of Sales & Marketing with the Reid Newspaper Group prior to taking over the General Manager's position following John's death in March, 2021.

"First we got involved in the Vinita Journal," Janet recalls. "We were printing The American newspaper and when it came up for sale, we purchased it. Then, the Nowata Star came up for sale. John said, 'that's a newspaper in a county seat. We have to buy that. The Grand Laker and Grand Paradise Magazine are my babies," Janet says proudly.

The Grand Laker is the only weekly leisure publication promoting the entire Grand Lake area. It was recently named 2022 Business of the Year by the South Grand Lake Area Chamber of Commerce.

"That's because of Mary Claiborne," Janet says bluntly. "Some people know her as 'Mary,' others know her as 'Lady Shutterbug' or 'Arizona,' but that award really belongs to her. I'm pretty sure she has covered more events and taken more pictures of more area happenings than anyone in Grand Lake's history. Mary has had an incredible impact on both the *Grand Laker* and the Grand Lake community," she says with obvious pride.

In addition to four children, Janet has seven grandchildren. She lives in The Coves on South Grand Lake, but she is virtually everywhere on Grand Lake every week — and involved in a wide variety of events, fundraising efforts, and philanthropic ventures. She recently partnered with Shangri-La Resort to raise money for the purchase of armored vests for all Delaware County Deputies. She raises money for fireworks displays in Vinita and South Grand Lake. She supports a variety of non-profit organizations and new business ventures with both her money and her newspapers and magazines.

#### **WINE DINNER AT THE SUMMIT!**


