Shangri-La has become one of Oklahoma's premiere destinations for corporate groups, association meetings, weddings, retreats, parties, banquets, and family reunions – but the events don't "just happen." The popularity of special events at Shangri-La is the result of a dedicated team of professionals led by detail-oriented leadership at the top of the ladder. Meet Banquet Manager Bryan Gudka.

"I'm the main point of contact for someone who wants to have an event – anything from a six-person meeting to a dinner for 250," Bryan says. "It's my job to make sure everything is right - from setting up the room to serving dinner."

Bryan brings a unique set of skills and interests to the challenging job. A native of Keenesburg, Colorado, just outside of Denver, he graduated from the University of St. Mary's with a degree in Sports Management, with additional emphasis in business and digital marketing. A love of sports is in his DNA. Like both his father and brother, he played football in college; and his love of golf is another reason for his perfect fit at Shangri-La.

His first job out of college, in fact, was running Shiloh Springs Golf Course, a small public course located in the Kansas City suburb of Platte City, Missouri. His life's ambition of ultimately serving as president of a private golf club or CEO of a resort required a broadening of his experience and knowledge.

"At Shiloh, the operation didn't involve much food and beverage business, so I needed to work on that skill set. Now, everything I do is food & beverage – and I really enjoy it," he says.

It's a good thing he enjoys it, because the busiest months at Shangri-La mean 60-plus hours a week of making sure every event is done right. Bryan says there is an additional challenge of meeting expectations of groups that have held events previously at Shangri-La.

"Our team has always done a great job of meeting expectations. That's why more than ninety percent of groups who have held their events here immediately sign up for a return event. The biggest challenge I faced immediately was learning about the relationship our repeat customers already had with Shangri-la – and how they like to run their events.

"Everyone has a preconceived idea of what their event will look like. It's always a challenge when the client walks in and sees what the setup looks like. We're pretty good at making quick adjustments. We want everyone's event to either meet their expectations...or be a lot better than they thought it would be."

With more events already scheduled for 2023 than were held at the resort in all of 2022, the challenge is real, but Bryan is up for the challenge.

"We're starting to get really busy now. By April, we'll be in full swing," he says. "I'm in the process of getting fully staffed up and making sure we're ready for the incredibly busy times ahead. I'm blessed with a really good staff. I have two excellent banquet captains that have been here four or five years, so they can take a lot of smaller events by themselves and take those off my plate. That enables us to serve more people...and make sure we serve them all well."

An avid outdoorsman, Bryan was first introduced to Grand Lake several years ago by his parents. He was astonished to see the Shangri-La Resort development from the water – and it stuck in his memory.

"About four years later, I saw an opening here for Banquet Manager, and that seemed like a really good fit for me, so here I am on Monkey Island! I love the lake and I love Shangri-La. It's a great place to be."

Bryan juggles his busy work schedule to make time for fishing, hunting, and lake life. His love for golf remains a personal priority. He and Executive Chef Matt Hensley try to get together for a golf game at least once a week.

"I'm really lucky," he says. "I get to work at this incredible resort and live on this massive lake where wildlife is endless, and the golf is amazing. I'm really excited to be here – and I love what I do. I just want to make sure everything we do is done in such a way to exceed the expectations of our customers. Every event is different and unique. I enjoy the variety of having multiple events that are all different. Every day is a new day that brings new challenges. No day in my job is like the one before," he adds. "That makes it a lot of fun. I'm looking forward to a great summer!"

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Member Profile: Judi Barber By Mike Williams



Judi Barber: "Grand Lake has been a part of my life since I was a little girl. I wouldn't want to be anywhere else!"

Judi Barber is a driving force – a natural leader and a motivator to everyone who shares her passions. Whether it's golf, travel, the arts, or her lifelong commitment to education, Judi's passion for the things she loves seems to naturally propel her into top leadership roles in virtually every arena she chooses to enter.

She graduated from high school in Valley Falls, Kansas before moving to Norman, Oklahoma where she obtained three degrees from the University of Oklahoma. A former teacher, a 19year public school principal, and an Adjunct Professor at OU, Judi (Dr. Barber) concluded her public education career with a five-year stint as Director of Curriculum and Instruction for the Norman Public Schools (K-12). She received the University of Oklahoma College of Education Award as Outstanding Alumnus, as well as OU's Career Achievement Award and the OU Regents' Alumni Award, and is an inductee in the Oklahoma Educators Hall of Fame.

She now runs a consulting company, Collaborating for Results, Inc., a consultant company she founded in 2000 following her brilliant career in public education.

"My consulting work now is primarily organizational development for schools," she says. "There are some pieces in all organizations that need a little extra attention. I look at the organization as a whole, their work, and check their results. It isn't something that is a one-time thing. It's an ongoing process."

Judi's roots run deep in Grand Lake area soil. She spent much of her youth growing up here.

"I was on Grand Lake as a little girl. I split my life between my mom & dad and my aunt & uncle when I was growing up," she explains. "My Aunt was 10 years older than my mother, and they didn't have any children. My mother said she would share me with them – and she did. My aunt & uncle had a bakery in Columbus, Kansas. They moved to Grand Lake in 1956 and bought 100 acres on the lake. A lot of that property we cleared by hand. And twenty-one acres of that same property in Carey Bay is where I have my home now."

Although Judi's interests and commitments are widely varied, there is very little in her life that outshines her focus on golf.

"I'm passionate about golf," she confesses. "I got that from my Dad, I guess. He played on the KU golf team in college, and always played every week – at least. I'm not necessarily good at it, but I'm totally addicted."

Judi is past president of the Shangri-La Women's Golf Association and is in charge of the "away" games for the group. She organizes activities for the entire Interclub Association (including Shangri-La, Owasso, Hillcrest in Bartlesville, Indian Springs, Forest Ridge and Muskogee) and coordinates play with the Women's Oklahoma Golf Association.

However, golf isn't Judi's only passion that has become more of an avocation. She serves as President of the relatively new Grove Area Creative Alliance which serves as a resource for creators and cultural entrepreneurs, stressing the importance of creativity in the community, and helping to advance the appeal of the Grand Lake area as a premier destination. The Alliance has undertaken an aggressive publicity campaign called "Imagine Grand." The campaign highlights such activities as theatrical performances, band concerts, living history exhibits, community festivals, botanical highlights, art exhibits, music festivals, and ongoing entertainment at restaurants, among others.

"There are so many creative events and ongoing activities in our area, but they sometimes get overlooked," Judi says. "We want to change that, by helping people imagine the creative opportunities we have all around us – not just in Grove, but in the entire Grand Lake area."

By bringing new attention to creative activities, Judi says the Alliance hopes to help build attendance at events and encourage a greater appreciation of the thriving arts scene around Grand Lake.

"Our goal is to help enrich our community with more awareness and involvement in creative arts throughout the area," she explains.

Her personal interest in the arts extends beyond the Grand Lake shoreline, though. She travels frequently to Tulsa to enjoy presentations by the Tulsa Performing Arts – and numerous other venues. She loves to travel. France is one of her favorite destinations out of a host of countries she has visited throughout Europe and Central America.

Her commitment to golf and Shangri-La Golf Club remains a major focus for Judi. She and her late husband Dennis became Shangri-La members in 1998. They maintained their membership through the difficult years for the resort, and the re-emergence since the purchase of the club by Eddy Gibbs in 2010. Judi couldn't be happier about the growth and developments she has seen at Shangri-La.

"I can't wait until The Battlefield opens. That new Par 3 Course is another exciting development that just demonstrates the commitment the ownership and management at Shangri-La have to the Grand Lake community. I'm very excited about The Battlefield. It's going to be a shorter course and, at my age, I'm hoping it will improve my skills," she laughs. "We stuck with Shangri-La through all the bad times," she says, "and now we're enjoying the good times. The development of Shangri-La Golf Club – and the entire resort – is incredible.
