Winter officially arrives on the calendar at 9:27 p.m. Thursday, December 21 – but it has already arrived at Shangri-La Marina. The marina has been winterized. There is no water on the docks and pump-out facilities have been winterized for the season.

If you haven't already done so, and your boat isn't equipped with bilge heating systems for winter boating, it's past time to get your boat winterized, as well. Even if you plan to boat through the winter, it's still a good idea to winterize your water and waste systems to avoid any problem with freezing lines. If you have been holding off to use your boat in the December 9 Christmas Lights Boat Parade, be sure you are scheduled for winterization immediately afterward. If you are not planning to winterize, please be sure we are aware so we can keep an extra eye on it when the weather gets unbearable.

If your boat is in Shangri-La Marina, contact Nichols Marine at 918-257-5500 to schedule your winterization. This is also the perfect time to schedule any service or repair work you might need to make sure your boat is ready when springtime strikes.

SHIP STORE HOURS - AND OUR HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

Staff Spotlight: Bogey

It's a Ruff Life for Bogey, Shangri-La's Director of Golf Course Control.

Before you start longing for "a dog's life," perhaps you should take a look into a day on the job for a working dog. A workday for "Bogey," whose title is either "Director of Golf Course Control" or "Golf Course Dog," depending on his performance at any given time, involves fifteen miles a day of running the course, chasing geese, arguing with the other dogs on Shangri-La Golf Club's canine crew, or working under the strict supervision of Golf Course Superintendent Justin May.

"Bogey is worth about \$3,500," Justin laughs. "The \$50 I paid for him and the \$3,000 in vet bill since then."

À rescue Border Collie, Bogey has seniority among the Shangri-La Golf Course Canine Crew. He'll soon be celebrating ten years on the job at Shangri-La having joined the golf course crew as a mere pup in the winter of 2014 – and has worked like a dog ever since.

Like many employees in lots of places, Bogey doesn't always stick to his assigned tasks.

"He checks the level in the water hazards," Justin moans. "And he's a regular at the Turn House trying to run quality control tests on the bacon; but he's really supposed to be keeping geese off the golf course. That's how he got the name 'Bogey.' Sometimes he just doesn't stay focused enough to make things happen exactly like he should. Just like our players, when things don't go exactly like they should, you end up with a bogey. That's how he got his name," Justin grins.

Bogey is a favorite with the staff and members at Shangri-La. He waits obediently on Justin's golf cart while meetings are going on. In his younger years, Bogey was out of his seat and off and running the instant Justin fired up

his golf cart – always trying to stay ahead of Justin and leading him where he's supposed to go.

"That's where those vet bills came in," Justin says. "He still works out like a pup some of the time. He starts and stops and darts and dodges so much, he has historically had some problems getting run over. But he's always been right back at work."

If you are not familiar with the four-legged "Director of Golf Course Control" job description, it involves working in the stifling heat and the crippling cold, year-round. Pay is embarrassingly low, but benefits are plentiful – all meals and snacks (including bacon) are provided, along with 100% paid medical and dental. Full room & board is paid, and transportation to and from work is provided daily. Breaks are provided for naps during the workday. Living expenses are provided including wardrobe care.

As Shangri-La's golf operation has expanded over the past decade, Bogey has built a staff and assumed more of a supervisory role. "Duke" recently left the staff to undertake a new job at Rose Creek in Edmond, but Bogey has four remaining staffers. Onslow takes care of responsibilities on the "Old Blue" course including the task of making sure no golf balls remain in the native hazards. Birdie works the Heritage Nine, keeping golf cart seats warm and watching for intrusive geese. Ace takes on the same assignment on Champions Nine and Bear works in both Maintenance (making sure the shop floor doesn't have crumbs on it and cleaning up leftovers in the break room) and Food & Beverage as both the official greeter and "bus dog" making certain there are no messy leftovers laying around.

In his supervisory role over the canine crew, Bogey is an experienced and capable leader, but he is a dog of few words. After enough snacks were found, we persuaded Bogey to share a few of his thoughts about life as a Golf Course Control supervisor at Shangri-La.

His favorite part of the golf course to search for those pesky geese?

"Ruff!

How would he describe his job?

"Ruff!"

How about life as a dog under the guidance of Golf Course Superintendent Justin May.

"Ruff!"

If you're on the golf course or around the club house, you will undoubtedly see Bogey. And yes, he accepts tips. Preferably...bacon.





He worked jobs throughout the country as a pipefitter before returning to Kansas, accepting a job at Logan & Company, a thriving construction company established in 1985. The company is a general contracting firm specializing in heavy industrial jobs - refineries, power plants, mechanical work, heavy equipment, general contractors After ten years on the job, he bought the company.

"My boss told me he was going to shut down the company," Shelby recalls. "Kira and I had just bought a house at Grand Lake. It wasn't a good time to be out of work, so I bought the company. It was scary at the time, but it's the best thing I've ever done."

"He can build or fix anything," Kira says with pride.

"If I only had the time," Shelby laughs. "Work interferes with my plans sometimes."

Kira grew up rodeoing and showing horses. After graduating from Labette County High School she went to Oklahoma State University.

"After a couple of years at OSU, my dad became ill, so I moved back home. Then life got in the way," she laughs. "I got married & had a couple of kids."

After life "got out of the way," Shelby and Kira married in 2007. Kira went back to school and got her teaching degree. After teaching Middle

School for eight years in Coffeyville, she took on teaching high school Algebra II, Honors Algebra II, and Algebra III in Parsons, Kansas.

"I love math. I love teaching, and I love my kids," Kira says. This year, however, will be her last as a teacher. This time, it wasn't just "life" that got in the way – it was "life at Grand Lake!"

"I had been coming to the lake for years to visit my sister," she says. "Then I got involved in a lot of stuff Joyce Duke was putting on at Shebang and Big Shots – the Kroakoff, Suckoff, Old Coots Talent Show – all of Joyce's wild events. She always persuaded me to perform with my two sisters. I obviously fell in love with the lake."

"Joyce Duke told us from the very beginning, 'you kids are going to have so much fun.' We asked her the other day about making money. She thought a minute, and said, 'you kids are going to have so much fun!"

Shelby and Kira have lots bigger plans for Big Shots, too. They will begin a remodeling process this month,
