Staff Spotlight: Selina Hoflund

Selina Hoflund, Shangri-La's new Director of People & Culture, has one of the most incredible American Dream success stories imaginable. Born and raised in Malaysia, she is quick to point out that, sadly, "in the Chinese culture, girls are of no value."

Her life's story is unimaginable to most of us, beginning when her birth mother was told that, as a girl, Selina would bring her bad luck – so she sold her newborn in exchange for two cans of milk and a chicken.

"That happens every day," she says. "In my culture, that's the norm."

That was not, however, the end of Selina's rocky road. Her adoptive mother died when she was only two years old, and she was raised by adoptive grandparents.

"I knew I had to go somewhere to make a new life," Selina recalls. "My grandmother gave me everything she had. It was \$7,000. She said 'take it and make a life for yourself.' I came to the USA at age 19 to go to college – and I have not left since."

Selina graduated from Central Washington University in Ellensburg, Washington. If that seems like an unusual destination for a 19-year-old from Malaysia, there's a reason.

"I didn't know there was both a Washington state and a 'D.C.' I said I wanted to be in the middle of everything in Washington, but I thought it was D.C. I ended up in the middle – but the middle of the State of Washington," she laughs. "It's probably a good thing. Looking back, I would probably have been terrified if I arrived as a young girl in Washington, D.C."

"My major in college was Management Science, but I'm a people person. When I took a job as a Human Resources Clerk, I decided that's where I wanted to be. That was my first job and, in the past 35 years, I've done every job in HR. That's all I've done since I left college." The transition from international student to permanent employment and residency in the U.S. was a task in itself for Selina.

"I was still on just a student visa, so I wrote a heart-wrenching story for the school paper about why I was in the U.S. and why I needed to work. Unbelievably, I received a four-year work visa in the mail a short time later. I know that's unheard of, but that's what happened to me. God has always had me in the palm of his hand. Things have always worked out for me. I'm a very blessed girl."

Selina has worked in Washington, Hawaii, Virginia, Wyoming, Montana, South Dakota – "and there were others," she laughs, "but that's enough."

Most recently, she was Interim HR Director at OSU Medical Center in Tulsa. She wanted out of the health care industry, and decided to apply when she saw a job posting for the position at Shangri-La.

"I didn't think I would get the job because I had no hospitality experience," she confesses. "But I thought, 'well 'hospital' is close to 'hospitality.' Maybe they'll take a look at me.' I met with GM Lance Funderburk and we just clicked instantly.

"I'm part of the proof that Shangri-La is a multi-cultural organization," she jokes. "My mother tongue is Chinese, and I'm fluent in three dialects, as well as my native language of Malay and, of course English."

What most of us have known as "Human Resources" during our careers is known at Shangri-La as "People and Culture."

"People make the culture of an organization," Selina explains. "Part of what we do is about making sure people we work with are creating the right culture for the organization so the organization can thrive. The success of any organization comes down to its culture – and that culture all comes down to the people.

"My job is to make sure we give people the tools to succeed in their job and provide them with all of the information about benefits, goals, expectations - everything they need to succeed. Getting people to shift from behavior that doesn't serve them is my most difficult goal," she says. "I'm really passionate about young people. I see the younger generation coming into the work force without much knowledge about what to expect or what to do. Our lives are all about the decisions we make in life. I love helping them learn how to make the right decisions."

With her busy and hectic career, Selina never had children, but she has a stepson. Her husband is retired from a career in Health Promotion and Wellness, having most recently headed up the Tobacco Cessation Program in Wyoming. Selina remains on Monkey Island during the week, but she and her husband live on two acres near Skiatook.

"I have a husband, a stepson, and a cat," she grins. "I love camping – or more appropriately 'glamping.' I love knitting. I don't know why, except that's stress-free. I make a lot of scarves, hats, afghans – and give them to the poor. I love reading – and writing.

"I'm hoping who I am will rub off on people around here. I really want to change the direction of the lives of the young people I'm privileged to work with. I love it here," she says. "I love the feel of belonging to a family that is passionate about what they do. I feel that vibe at Shangri-La. I feel like I'm home."

Jack and Nancy Adkisson: Living the Grand Lifestyle - and Adding to It!

It's safe to say no one thoroughly enjoys the Grand Lake lifestyle more than Jack and Nancy Adkisson. It is equally safe to say no one gives back more to their community. "A Grand Lake Celebration" is a good example – a two-day holiday celebration for all Grand Lakers featuring fabulous music and appetizers furnished for all comers to celebrate the Christmas holidays. This was the second year the couple has hosted the festive event at Shangri-La Resort Hotel for all who wanted to join the celebration.

Theirs is an inspiring up-from-the-bootstraps story of success. Jack grew up in Jenks, Oklahoma, attended Conners Junior College on a football scholarship, then OU on an academic scholarship before graduating with honors from the University of Tulsa with a degree in Economics and Mathematics. He also enlisted in the Marine Corps Reserves while he was at Conners Junior College, and served for six years.

One of five children, and the only girl, Nancy was "born in the bayou," she laughs – Lake Charles, Louisiana. Her father was a pipefitter and the family moved regularly. When her father was transferred to Hawaii, Nancy moved to Tulsa to live with relatives while finishing high school.

"I was dead set on getting out of high school," she says, "so I moved to Tulsa and lived with family. I had enough credits to graduate a semester early from Will Rogers High School. I knew I wanted to go to college, but I just didn't have the money. So, I got a job working at an insurance company."

She worked for the tuition money, though, and attended Tulsa Junior College for a semester before transferring to Tulsa University where she earned a degree in accounting, and went to work for an oil company which helped her with tuition to earn her Masters Degree.

Both avid dancers, Jack and Nancy actually met at a dance club, introduced by mutual friends at the club.

"There weren't online dating sites back then, so we got to see right up front what we were getting into," Nancy jokes. "We saw each other off and on, but our first actual date was at a TU Alumni football game. We started hanging out together – and eventually got married. We both always worked, but we tried to set aside Friday nights for just the two of us."

"We still have friends from those days," Jack adds, "but we still go someplace every Friday night. It's still our 'date night' after all these years. We've been married since '67." "That's NINETEEN sixty-seven," Nancy laughs.

They still maintain their love for dancing, though. Over the years, they have taken lessons in ballroom dancing, twostep – even disco!

In 1979, the Adkisson's founded Triad Precision Products which manufactures metallic and non-metallic gaskets for heat exchangers, pipelines, and valves. Operations include a large machine shop with industrial lasers, brakes, mills, routers, and various other cnc equipment. The company primarily services refineries and chemical plants, but they also service a variety of non-related industries such as ornamental cutting of staircases, signs, and gates. Triad Precision has grown exponentially, including worldwide sales, although their market is primarily for refineries within the borders of the United States.

In addition to Triad, the Adkissons now own Hidden Valley Farms, a 170-acre pecan farm near Ramona in northeastern Oklahoma. They own the farm with their son, Glen, who is also Vice-President of Triad.

"Our son is a total outdoor freak. He was trying to find a place to just be outdoors and get away from things," Nancy says. "He wanted to buy some property and he asked if we would partner with him. We finally said we would, but the property had to have utilities and a source of income. So now we're involved with the property that has 1,000 pecan trees and a natural gas well."

"Glen loves it, though," Jack says. "He keeps it looking like a golf course. We do that as a family. It's like any farming operation. In a good year, we produce about 60,000 pounds of pecans. We give some away, but mostly we sell them wholesale in 1,500-pound bags."

"Glen is working today and we're not," Nancy laughs, "So it's a good partnership."

Jack and Nancy's first introduction to the Grand Lake lifestyle came when Jack's family built a home at Dinosaur Point in the 1960s.

"There were seven families from Jenks who had homes at Dinosaur Point," Jack recalls. "That's how we got introduced to Shangri-La when it first opened in 1969. We came to Grand Lake to visit on the weekends."

"We came to the lake any time people would invite us," Nancy adds. "We didn't have the money to come unless someone invited us."

The couple continues to maintain their primary residence at Bailey Ranch in Owasso. Although they have spent a lot of time at Grand Lake over the years, they didn't purchase a Grand Lake home themselves until 2004 in what was then called Turnberry (now Sunset Bay). For longtime lakers, that development is where Shangri-La's old Bay West Club used to be prior to being destroyed by fire.

"Shangri-La was in such a state of disrepair by then, we were actually considering moving to South Grand Lake because Shangri-La was closing," Jack recalls. "It took us a year to find a place because the entire Monkey Island area was going downhill due to the demise of the resort."

"We would play golf at Shangri-La and pull weeds out of the greens while we were waiting to putt. It was pretty bad," Nancy adds.

"Then came Eddy Gibbs and made all the Monkey Island homeowners look pretty smart," Jack says. "We love it here.

We love everything about Shangri-La. The staff members are more than just staff. They are our friends."

Aside from their continued interest in dance, the couple enjoys golf, often playing together at Shangri-La or at Owasso's Patriot Golf Club, where they are also members. "It also seem like we drink a lot of wine these days," Nancy jokes. "We're members of a lot of wine clubs!

"We intend to move to Grand Lake full time," she adds, "because we love Shangri-La and we love the lake. We love it here. We love the people, especially – and you can't look at the lake without being mesmerized.

"We're just getting started," she says. "We've got a few years to go. We're always looking to the future. We've been blessed with great friends in a great community. We may come to Monkey Island by ourselves, but we're never by ourselves once we get here. You're never by yourself at Shangri-La!"
